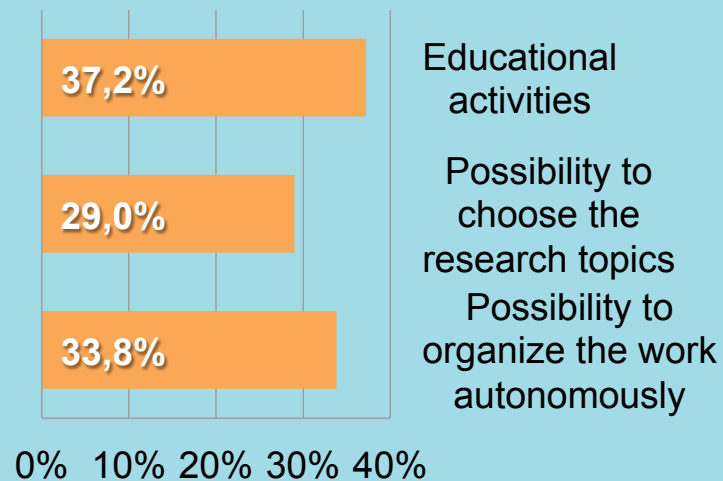

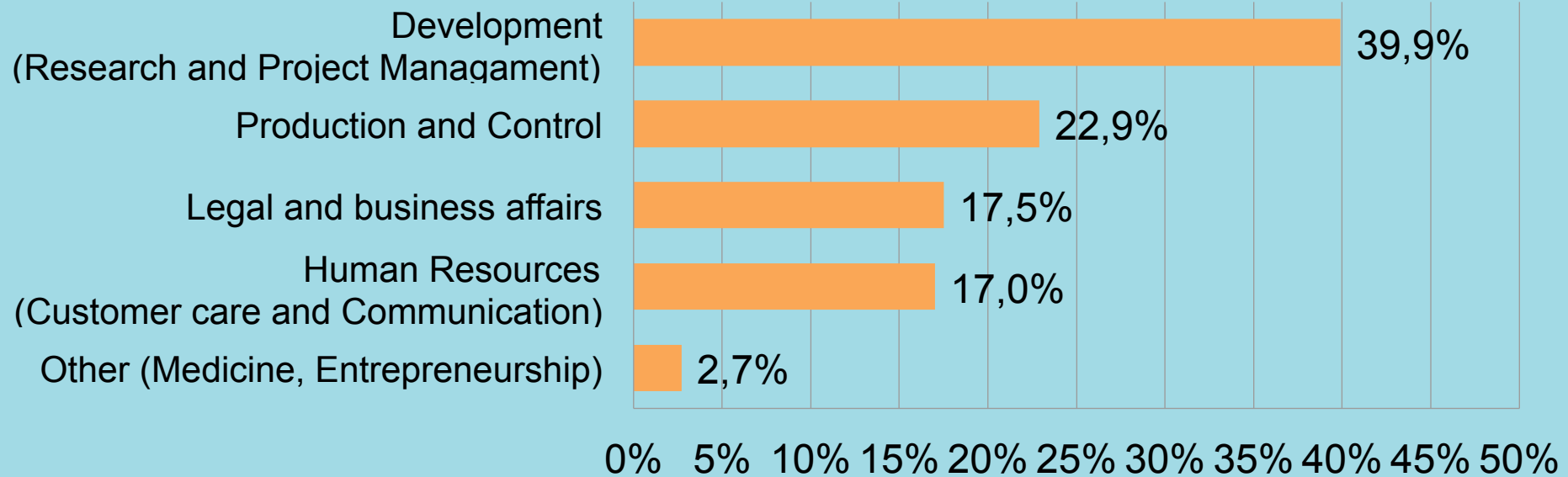

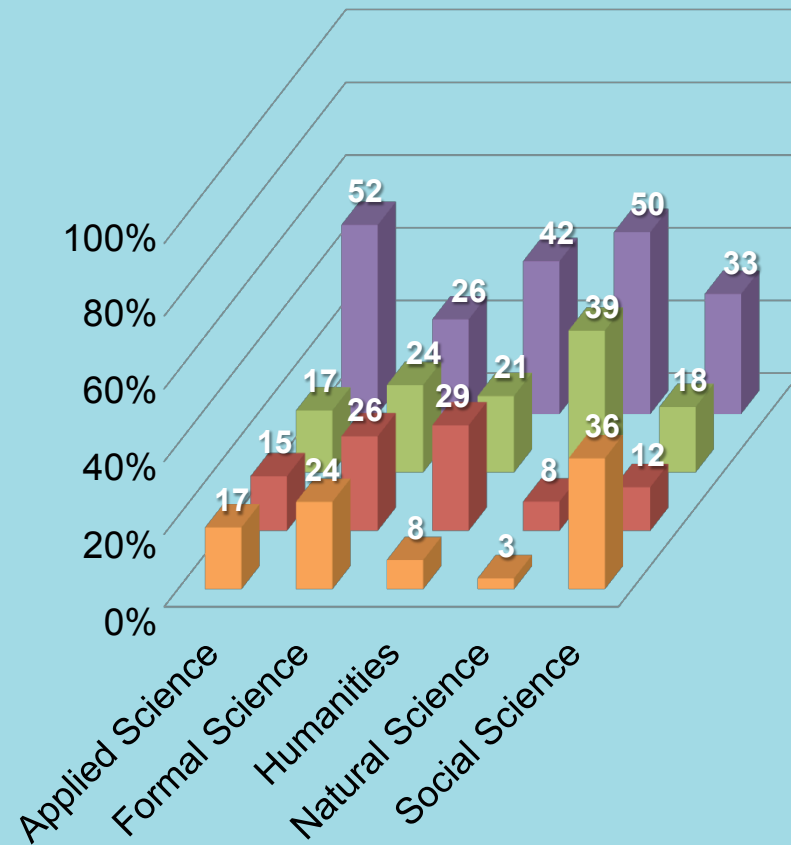

In the private sector, in which areas do you think a PhD holder can have the biggest chance to be hired?



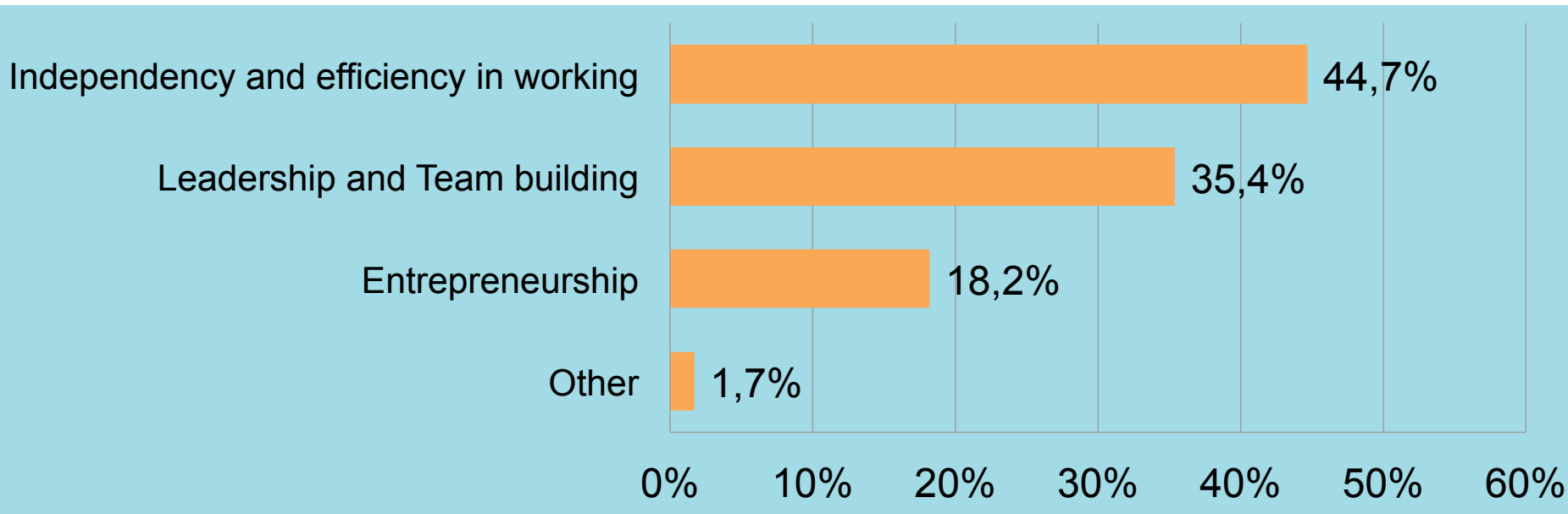

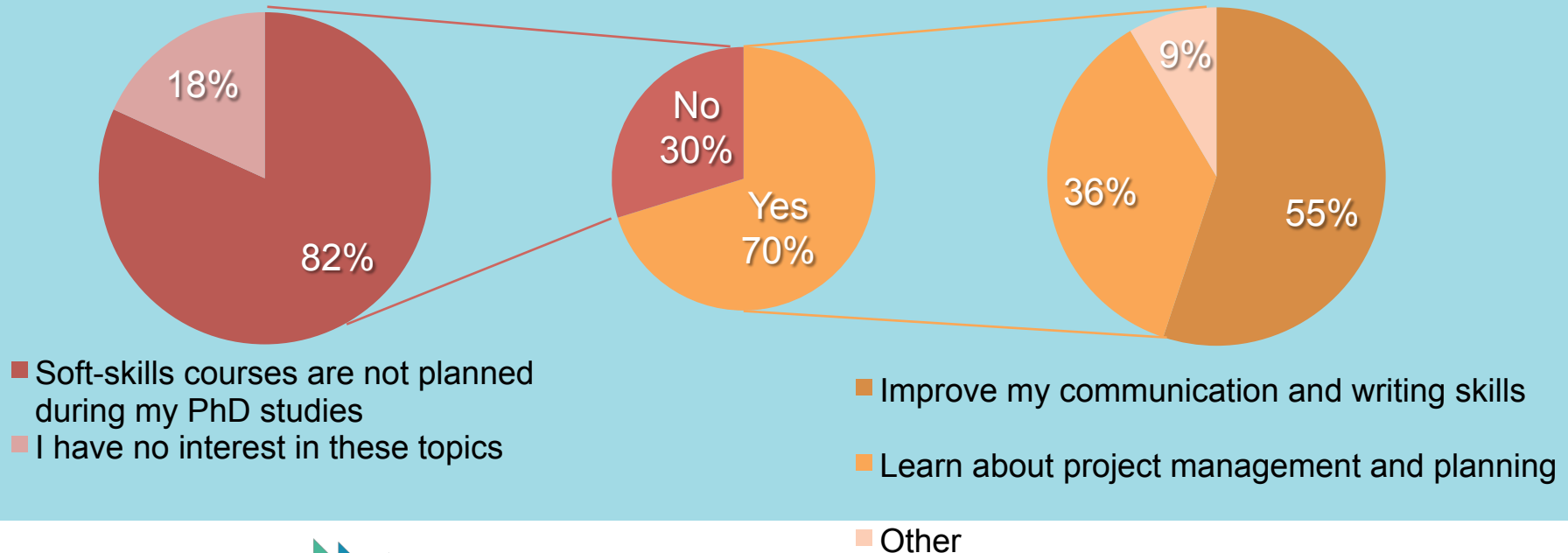

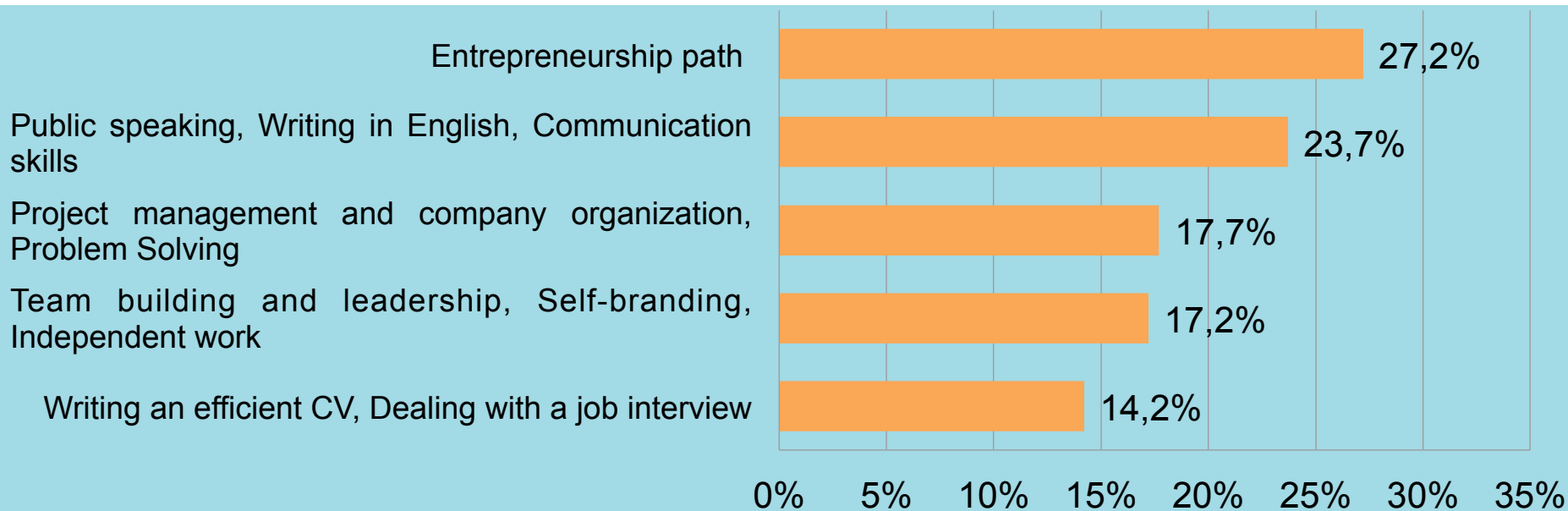
